Twenty-Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time

The apostles, Luke tells us, said to the Lord, "Increase our faith". Now to know what they were asking for, we need a bit of context. Faith is one of the most important words in the Bible, and one of the most studied, discussed and disputed. It boils down to being a matter of life and death – eternal life and eternal death. So even though we have some understanding of what it is and what it is meant to do, it's always worth trying to get a better grasp of it, of its meaning and purpose.

Jesus has just suggested to his followers that they humbly correct an erring brother or sister, and grant forgiveness for offences without setting any limit to the number of times we forgive. This seems to them to be more than is humanly possible. The apostles realise they need God's help, God's grace, if they are to have any chance of complying with Jesus' teaching. It is by having greater faith than they have now that they look to receiving that help from God.

Now faith in this context is obviously not reducible to just giving assent to, just agreeing with statements or propositions concerning God which demand that assent. 'I believe in one God, the Father Almighty...I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord... I believe in the resurrection of the dead.' It's not only an intellectual matter. It's a matter of trusting God when he reveals himself through his chosen and authorised witnesses, and especially through his Son, Jesus; of trusting him when he assures us of his love, and tells us of his plan to rescue us from our sinful self-centredness so as to live with him in a life and a joy that can have no end.

Faith is a gift from God that we freely receive or freely refuse. Paul urges his disciple Timothy to "fan into a flame" the gift that God gave him when Paul laid hands on him. This most likely refers to the laying on of hands that occurs when a person is baptised and confirmed, when a person receives the sacraments that mark us as followers of Jesus, imbued not "with a spirit of timidity, but with the Spirit of power, and love and self-control." The faith that Jesus and Paul speak of already has a strong dose of trust, or hope, which is the middle one of the three theological – the God-inspired and God-directed – virtues, and it has at least the beginnings of love, the third and greatest of those virtues. Without love, faith is as if dead, and does not achieve what it is meant to do unite us to God in a life-giving way. Jesus speaks hyperbolically about the power of faith when he says, "Were your faith the size of a mustard seed" (a very small seed, indeed) "you could say to this mulberry tree" (Matthew speaks of a mountain in a similar passage) "Be uprooted and planted in the sea, and it would obey you." What he's saying is that faith can enable us to do and to endure what is humanly impossible in our efforts to be his followers.

'To be a believer is not a matter for self-congratulation, however: to answer God's call is simply one's duty' (Glenstal Bible Missal, 1349). "When you have done all that you have been told to do, say, 'We are merely servants; we have done no more than our duty."

The prophet Habbakuk uttered a statement about faith, and faithfulness that is taken up and repeated in the preaching of Paul, and was one of St Augustine's most frequently-repeated quotes from scripture: "the righteous live by their faith." That was the kind of faith that empowered people like St Francis, whose feast falls on Tuesday, like Saint Mary of the Cross MacKillop, in their dedicated prayerful and apostolic lives. They took seriously the understanding expressed in the last sentence of our reading from Paul to Timothy: "You have been trusted to look after something precious; guard it with the help of the Holy Spirit who lives in us." *(cont)*

I don'[t think we can avoid having this hardening of heart happen to us if we don't have a regular practice of humble prayer in our daily lives – not just saying prayers, but really opening our minds and hearts to the All-knowing God. NEW GUIDELINES FOR CHURCH RESPONSE TO ABUSE

The ACBC has released a statement about the development of new national guidelines that will inform the way Church authorities, including dioceses, respond to contemporary and historical allegations about the abuse of children or vulnerable adults. The new guidelines will make the way Church entities respond to such concerns consistent, and will help create a more transparent and accountable culture in the way the Church responds. As the release explains, the new guidelines will be developed with reference to the new National Catholic Safeguarding Standards, which were launched in May.
