Jesus Gives Himself to Us

It is a divine communion.



When we invite friend for a meal, we do much more than offer them food for their bodies. We offer friendship, fellowship, good conversation, intimacy, and closeness. When we say, "Help yourself... take some more...don't be shy...have another glass," we offer our guests not only our food and our drink but also ourselves. A spiritual bond grows, and we become food and drink for one another. In the most complete and perfect way, this happens when Jesus gives himself to us in the Eucharist as food and drink. By offering us his Body and Blood, Jesus offers us the most intimate communion possible.

The Most Human and Most Divine Gesture

The two disciples whom Jesus joined on the road to Emmaus recognized him in the breading of the bread. What is a more common, ordinary gesture than breaking bread? It may be the most human of all human gestures: a gesture of hospitality, friendship, care, and the desire to be together. Taking a loaf of bread, blessing it, breaking it, and giving it to those seated around the table signifies unity, community, and peace. When Jesus does this he does the most ordinary as well as the most extraordinary. It is the most human as well as the most divine gesture.



The great mystery is that this daily and most human gesture is the way we recognize the presence of Christ among us. God becomes most present when we are most human.

The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ

Today we celebrate the feast of the Body and Blood of Christ. We cannot gather to receive Christ in the physical form of bread and wine but Eucharist is much more than this. Today gather together with friends and family around a table, share a meal.

'When we gather around the table and eat from the same loaf and drink from the same cup, we are most vulnerable to one another. We cannot have a meal together in peace with guns hanging over our shoulders and pistols attached to our belts. When we break bread together we leave our arms –whether they are physical or mental- at the door and enter into a place of mutual vulnerability and trust.

The beauty of the Eucharist is precisely that it is the place where a vulnerable God invites vulnerable people to come together in a peaceful meal. When we break bread and give it to each other, fear vanishes and God becomes very close." Henri Nowen

All: In the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Amen

Reader: A reading from the holy Gospel according to John.

Jesus said to the Jews:

'I am the living bread which has come down from heaven.

Anyone who eats this bread will live for ever;

and the bread that I shall give is my flesh, for the life of the world.'

Then the Jews started arguing with one another: 'How can this man give us his flesh to eat?' they said. Jesus replied:

'I tell you most solemnly, if you do not eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you will not have life in you. Anyone who does eat my flesh and drink my blood has eternal life, and I shall raise him up on the last day.

For my flesh is real food and my blood is real drink.

He who eats my flesh and drinks my blood lives in me and I live in him.

As I, who am sent by the living Father, myself draw life from the Father, so whoever eats me will draw life from me.

This is the bread come down from heaven; not like the bread our ancestors ate: they are dead, but anyone who eats this bread will live for ever.'

My Father, when will we learn –

Sometimes you laugh at it, Sometimes you cry it, often you sing it. Sometimes it's wild peace, then crying hurt, often humiliating, never deserved.

You see EUCHARIST in another's eyes, Give it in another's hand held tight, Squeeze it in an embrace. You pause EUCHARIST in the middle of a busy day, Speak it in another's ear, Listen to it from a person who wants to talk.

For EUCHARIST is as simple as being on time And as profound as sympathy, I give you my supper, I give you my sustenance, I give you my life, I give you me,



PARISH SACRAMENTAL CELEBRATIONS

PRAY FOR OUR SEMINARIANS


