### **IMPORTANT COVID-19 UPDATE: Face to Face Masses at St Theresa's Parish**

The St Theresa's CovidSafe plan only allows 108 people in the parish centre following the 4m<sup>2</sup> rule.

On Weekday Masses and Sunday Morning masses, parishioners are to be seated in rows with a red ribbon

On **Saturday Vigil Masses**, parishioners are asked to sit in rows without a red ribbon.

Please leave 3 chairs between households.

### Weekday Masses—no booking required

St Theresa's will be having mass on **Wednesdays and Fridays at 9am.** Wednesday's mass will not be recorded at the present time.

Parishioners will need to sign a contact's list which we are required to record and keep contact details for 56 days from the day collected.

Hand sanitiser will be provided and as per health directives, please stay home if you are unwell.

### Weekend Masses-booking required

St Theresa's regular weekend masses continue (unless otherwise directed) at 6pm Saturday vigil and 9.30am Sunday morning. Unfortunately, no gathering can occur after mass and parishioners are encouraged to go straight home.

For each weekend, parishioners will need to either purchase a ticket online from Trybooking website, by right clicking on the link or double-clicking on the link provided <u>https://www.trybooking.com/book/event?eid=640220&</u> and choose open link command OR contact the parish by phone 46394688 to register for your preferred mass.

If you are unwell or not comfortable to join the weekend masses at this time, St Pat's Cathedral will always be streaming 9am mass each and every Sunday. *Toowoomba Diocese* – <u>www.twb.catholic.org.au</u>

### **Bulletins, Seating and Reception of Communion directives**

Bulletins will continue to be emailed to parishioners now. Those parishioners who have had paper copies delivered and anyone else who does not receive an emailed copy can collect their bulletins at the end of mass as they are leaving or from the office during the week. Any bulletins left in the church must be binned. If you do not receive an emailed copy of the bulletin and wish to have a bulletin emailed to you each week, please contact the office with your email address or see Monica or Fr. Brian after mass.

Seating will be in alternate rows for each mass. Rows are marked with red ribbon or no ribbon. Households can sit together with 3 chairs between households.

Communion will only be received via the centre aisle and only under one species. The priest will generally be the sole minister of communion.

#### **Keep Rowing!**

I vividly remember as a young boy swimming on a coastal beach and being dumped in the surf. I was tossed around topsy turvy and was very aware of the power of the waves. I survived, but since then have always been afraid of turbulent water.

This Gospel resonates with that experience, and it resonates with lots of experiences in our lives.

Have you ever felt swamped by an event — a traumatic accident, the death of someone we love, betrayal by a friend, the loss of a job, failure in an exam — which seems to leave us floundering? A sudden tempest storms into our life and we can't find our feet, can be quite literally gasping for air, we can feel we are drowning.

That is when we can cry out in our individual distress 'Lord, save me' and Our Lord will extend his hand, pull us from the turbulent water, get into the boat of life with us and calm the storm.

But, and this is very important, Our Lord will not take us back as if by magic to the previous situation. The storm might be behind us, but we have to press on.

The disciples had started off from the Jewish side of the Sea of Galilee, familiar territory. Jesus guided them through the stormy situation to "the other side", the pagan side, unfamiliar territory where they would not have felt at home.

It takes courage for us to move to a new situation, but with Our Lord's presence we need not be as afraid as we would otherwise be.

But this Gospel is not so much about individuals as it is about the Church. It is about the disciples of Jesus around the figure of Peter. We are the disciples of Jesus gathered in the boat with the successor of St Peter, Pope Francis.

When the Church is buffeted by storms, it is often because the Church is in the midst of a journey from familiar to unfamiliar territory. We can all list some of the storms of the past fifty years.

There is a new attitude to authority. Rule by dictate or decree with unreflecting obedience is not possible except in a few remaining authoritarian or totalitarian regimes. Rome-based clerics and bishops have to get used to this new situation, and Our Lord says to them 'keep rowing' to the unfamiliar shore.

There is a new attitude to gender roles. The feminist movement has challenged many of the stereotypes by which women had been subjugated over the centuries. Males have got to get used to this new situation and Our Lord says to us 'keep rowing' to the unfamiliar shore.

Pope Francis is rowing in the right direction on that score. As he has said: 'The challenge today is this, to think about the specific place of women also in those places where the authority of the Church is exercised for various areas of the Church.' [A Big Heart Open to God, America: National Catholic Review 30/9/13]

There is a new attitude to priests and bishops. There is anger and suspicion at sexual abuse and its cover up. Transparency and responsibility are demanded. Clergy have got to get used to this new situation. Our Lord says 'keep rowing' to an unfamiliar shore.

Of course, throwing tradition overboard willy nilly is not a solution either. There is Tradition with a capital 'T' which is the Spirit-led experience of Catholic Christianity over two millennia. That is not to be jettisoned. But the grace of discernment is needed.

In particular, Our Lord will not allow us the indulgence of nostalgic yearning for the safety of the past country inhabited by the Church. We must make our way to the other shore.

Perhaps we are called to help build a new structure of the Church on that other shore. We know the preferred model put forward by the current successor of St Peter: 'I see the Church as a field hospital after battle. ... Heal the wounds, heal the wounds. ... And you have to start from the ground up.'

We can row with courage because we know we are in the same boat as Peter to whom our Risen Lord constantly extends a saving hand. 'Do not be afraid.' © Fr Michael Tate; mtate@bigpond.com
