

You will be remembered each day right from the start. For the memories that we shared forever live within our hearts.

Reflection

We are baptised members of God's family; we are members of the Church, the Bride of Christ. Specifically we are members of the Church 'Militant' fighting for our faith and our God on this earthly pilgrimage. As such, what is our mission? What is our purpose as the Baptised? It is to do what Christ commanded us: "go... make disciples of all nations; baptise them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teach them to observe all the commands I gave you" (Mt 28:19-20). Our mission is simple: proclaim the salvation won for us by Jesus Christ and the way to attain this salvation. What is the way to that salvation? As Our Lord says "observe all the commands I gave you." In this way we will be His witnesses to the ends of the earth by our steadfast faith and by our countercultural and wholly God-oriented way of life.

But what commands did Jesus give us? He gave us many rules for living a life pleasing to the Father – all of which are summed up in the law of love: "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind and with all your strength... [and] love your neighbour as yourself" (Mk 12:30-31). In doing this we are called to imitate the sacrificial, self-emptying love of our Lord who "became obedient to death, even death on a cross" (Phil 2:6-8). Therefore our witness to Christ is incomplete if we do not live His commands and teach others to do the same.

As we celebrate the ascension of our Lord into heaven we turn our minds and our hearts towards the constancy of His presence in the world. He no longer walks among us as He did 2000 years age. But are we alone? No. Is Jesus present now to us? Yes. How? In His Church. How is Jesus present in His Church? First and foremost in the sacraments into which the visible presence of our Redeemer has passed, such that by tangible signs and symbols He lives amongst us invisibly just as truly as He did visibly among the apostles. Thus Christ instituted the sacraments for the continuation of His presence among us and the sanctification of the world. Since our Lord also instituted the priesthood to perpetuate His presence in the sacraments He is present in a special way in the ordained ministers of the Church. And, of course, He is present in each of us by our partaking of the Eucharist, His true body and true blood, in which we become what we consume – the mystical body of Christ.

So we have great reason to rejoice today, for in His ascension Christ goes ahead of us and raises us above all the angels and every choir of heaven. He sits now at the right hand of the Father governing all creation and He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead. This what we long for. It is what we work for, and pray for, and love for. Are you living with heaven in mind?


