#### Francis' Focus

Advent, Pope Francis suggests, should awaken 'sleepy Christians'. It is a time to stop 'dozing off' into spiritual apathy and indifference.

The Pope encourages us to use Advent to consider how we live our faith. Perhaps we have become too worldly, or spiritually insular? Maybe our prayers have become dull and routine, rather than heartfelt? Whatever the case, now is the moment to reflect on what really matters and act. Not tomorrow, not at Christmas, not after the holidays – Now!

There is an urgency to Advent, which this week's Gospel puts right in front of us. As Jesus says, we must be wakeful and alert! He speaks of things to do – stand, watch, pray – which shows us that the Christian life must be more than passive routines.

Framed by Jesus' call to his disciples, the Pope suggests that Advent should be spent 'looking beyond ourselves, expanding our mind and heart in order to open ourselves up to the needs of people, of brothers and sisters, and to the desire for a new world.' It is, he adds, 'a favourable time to open our hearts, to ask ourselves concrete questions about how and for whom we expend our lives.' © *Nick Brodie* 

## Gospel Reflection - The Coming of our Saviour

When my father died some years ago, the light went out of my mother's life: there was an intense longing to be reunited with him. The in-between time was almost devoid of meaning. His life on earth was full of constructive, good activities in many spheres. But for the boys, we sons, there is a sense of things unfinished, of a legacy which has to be worked at before we see the really final working out of the plan of his life.

I think it was exactly the same for the followers of Jesus after his crucifixion and resurrection and then the withdrawal of his physical presence.

The light seemed to go out of the lives of many of the disciples; there was an intense longing to be reunited with him; the time between his earthly ministry and his return in glory at the end of history had to somehow be given a meaning.

For his followers there was a sense of things unfinished, so the meaning came from the disciples working on his legacy, so that they could contribute to the really final working out of the plan of Jesus' life.

It is the same for us. We have to work at translating the legacy of Our Lord Jesus Christ. He has, in principle, rescued us from the Power of Darkness. We have to work at translating that legacy into our personal lives, into the life of the Church, into the life of our society.

And don't we at times intensely long for Our Lord to more clearly manifest himself? Sometimes our own lives, the life of the Church, the life of our society, so clearly cry out for Jesus to come again and rescue us.

In some instances, and to varying degrees, we can become conscious of Jesus' saving, transforming power in a particular situation. But, for the whole of humanity across the millennia, we do not know the day or the hour when death and all its warriors such as disease and violence, will be absolutely vanquished by Christ in glory.

This can lead to a type of pain which finds solace in all those things which dull the spirit. Our Lord gives examples: debauchery, drunkenness. Today he might have added 'living in the virtual world'. Rather, Our Lord wants us to live in the real world on high alert.

In the meantime each one of us can be a signal of what is to come. I am thinking of:

- the heroic love of a parent for a child or, the sometimes harder, heroic love of a child for a parent,
- taking a risk with a friendship or your place in work or society, by speaking up where you see an injustice or some degrading of our world,
- being joyful in an over-the-top, extravagant way.

All these signal that the kingdom is already being established on earth. These can give you and me and those we care about hope in the future and faith in the power of unselfish love. They are real foretastes of the real future.

Let us continue to give reasons to each other for our hope and faith that: Christ *has* come, Christ *is* risen, Christ *will* come again. © *Fr Michael Tate; mtate@bigpond.com*


