One often hears the conventional wisdom: 'All religions are the same.' Somewhat different packaging but, really, they all believe in the same things.

But, do they, even about the human person?

What if you believed that the most vital part of a person was 'the soul', more or less trapped or imprisoned in the body? The best thing would be for the soul to be freed from the body, leaving the old carcass behind, and enjoying heaven as a soul.

Well, that may put you in an ancient Greek tradition, but it is certainly not Christian. What do we believe?

There is a hint in the pictures of the Stations of the Cross. Notice the haloes of light, a golden glow, around the head of our Lord Jesus Christ. Artists down through the centuries have tried to portray the Divine Light which suffuses the body of Christ (and of the Saints). These portrayals hark back to today's Gospel.

Jesus' body was transfigured. This was no out-of-the-body experience of religious ecstasy. This was an utterly bodily experience with Jesus' body totally translucent, totally radiant with Divine Light. Every molecule of his materiality was reverberating in the halo of di-

That is the destiny which God desires for us also. When we are really in harmony with God, when we really participate in the life of God, then that Divine Life envelops and permeates our whole person, bodysoul. That is our ultimate destiny, but can it be anticipated in the lives of those close to God?

We have all heard of St Francis of Assisi or Padre Pio. Both saints exhibited the stigmata. Their devotion to the crucified Lord was so intense that they exhibited the wounds of the Cross in their bodies.

But, what if a saint, what if you or I, was intensely devoted to the transfigured Christ? Could one share in that transfigured experience?

Here is a story from the Russian mystical tradition.\* It is a passage taken from 'The Revelations' of Saint Seraphim of Sarov, written at the beginning of the 19th Century. One of his followers was conversing with him on a winter morning when the Saint appeared to his follower to be as dazzling as the sun. Saint Seraphim whispered to him:

'Why then, my friend, do you not look me straight in the face? Look freely and without fear; the Lord is with us.'

The story goes on in the words of the follower:

'Encouraged by these words, I looked and was seized by holy fear. Imagine in the middle of the sun, dazzling in the brilliance of its noontide rays, the face of the man who is speaking to you. You can see the movements of his lips, the changing expression of his eyes, you can hear his voice, you can feel his hands holding you by the shoulders, but you can see neither his hands nor his body – nothing except the blaze of light which shines around, lighting up with its brilliance the snow-covered meadow, and the snowflakes which continue to fall unceasingly.

"What do you feel?" asked Father Seraphim.

"An immeasurable well-being," I replied.

"But what sort of well-being? What exactly?"

"I feel", I replied, "such calm, such peace in my soul, that I can find no words to express

"My friend, it is the peace our Lord spoke of when he said to his disciples: 'My peace I give unto you,' the peace which the world cannot give; 'the peace which passeth all understanding.' What else do you feel?"

"Infinite joy in my heart."

My friends, that is the promise our Heavenly Father gives to you and to me personally and individually.

You and I can be, with God's grace will be, radiant with Divine Light, our bodies immersed in translucent glory, filled with 'immeasurable well-being', 'infinite joy in our

Pope Francis draws our attention to Peter, James and John. Understandably weary, they were struggling against sleep and almost missed the Transfiguration entirely!

'The drowsiness of the three disciples appears to be a discordant note', the Pope muses. These three disciples later fall asleep at Gethsemane! 'This sleepiness in such important moments is surprising', the Pope remarks.

In this regard, the apostles can help us think about Lent. 'It is a period', the Pope suggests, 'in which God wants to awaken us from our inner lethargy, from this sleepiness that does not let the Spirit express itself.'

In their sleepiness these apostles make good role models for us. Despite their exhaustion, they remained open to the working of Grace. 'We might think', the Pope says, 'that it was the light of Jesus that reawakened them.'

'Like them, we too are in need of God's light,' the Pope affirms. And that light, he adds, 'makes us see things in a different way: it attracts us, it reawakens us, it reignites our desire and strength to pray, to look within ourselves, and to dedicate time to others.' We might sometimes feel sleepy, in faith as in work, but we can still be witnesses to the Transfiguration if we are really open to the light of Christ.

## III. A journey of hope: three proposals

10. In teaching us to pray the "Our Father", Jesus begins by asking the Father to forgive our trespasses, but passes immediately to the challenging words:

"as we forgive those who trespass against us" (cf. *Mt* 6:12). In order to forgive others their trespasses and to offer them hope, we need for our own lives to be filled with that same hope, the fruit of our experience of God's mercy. Hope overflows in generosity; it is free of calculation, makes no hidden demands, is unconcerned with gain, but aims at one thing alone: to raise up those who have fallen, to heal hearts that are broken and to set us free from every kind of bondage.

## Second Sunday of Lent 15<sup>th</sup> & 16<sup>th</sup> of March 2025

13-year-old Toefuata'iga (Toy-foo-ah-tah-ing-ah), a student in the Upolu region of Samoa, experienced water scarcity at her school. The absence of a reliable and hygienic water supply has not only affected students' education but also impacted their health. Despite being surrounded by water, many Samoans struggle with consistent access to clean drinking water, and resort to relying on rainwater or neighbours who have access to a water pipeline. Climate change is leading to longer, drier periods. The Samoan Water pipeline frequently shuts down due to natural disasters and maintenance. Additionally, it is often unsafe for consumption after heavy rains . "School would finish early, when there wasn't any water, we wouldn't have classes," Toefuata'iga shared.

Access to water is about more than convenience. It is the key to breaking the cycle of poverty, and to helping students like Toefuata'iga fulfil her dreams: "I would like to become a good teacher. To teach the children so they will have a brighter future."

Toefuata'iga also told a personal story: "If the water we drink is dirty, we get sick." This was particularly hard on her family. "My grandmother needed water, so we went and got her some. We did not know it was dirty..." Three days later her grandmother fell ill.
