'Every good and worthwhile human activity', Pope Leo says, 'is in some way a reflection of God's infinite beauty, and sport is certainly one of these.'

Sport, the pope explains, 'challenges us to relate to others and with others, not only outwardly but also, and above all, interiorly. It shows us the importance of 'giving of ourselves, putting ourselves "in play" ... giving of ourselves for others.'

The pope therefore wants us to approach sport as a means, not an end. It is good for us when it is 'for our personal improvement, for our athletic supporters, for our loved ones, our coaches and colleagues, for the greater public, and even for our opponents.'

In this spirit, the pope wants us to appreciate that sport itself is 'an important means of reconciliation and encounter', which can teach us 'the value of cooperating, working together and sharing.' He hopes it provides us 'a valuable and concrete means of bringing individuals together' in our highly fractured world. He sees its potential for teaching us 'the art of losing, to confront one of the deepest truths of our human condition: our fragility, our limitations and our imperfections.'

'It is daily training in love that brings us closer to final victory', he points out, 'and enables us to contribute to the building of a new world.'

Hate your father

I am told that, in most Middle Eastern languages, there is no word for 'prefer'. Perhaps influenced by extremes of heat and cold, the vocabulary of 'love' and 'hate' is used instead. No one can imagine Jesus 'hating' Joseph, but he clearly gave preference to his mission, even as a precocious 12 year old in the Temple.

In today's Gospel, Jesus was preparing his followers, imminently and over the generations, for persecution. This would include real-life situations of families denouncing a son or daughter, or a brother turning over a brother to the authorities.

Imagine a Chinese Catholic hearing this Gospel this morning, and this afternoon being betrayed by family members for remaining loyal to the successor of St Peter. Jesus exhorts such a follower to prefer this cross over what the family considers politically correct.

We could pause for a moment to pray for all families, torn apart for allegiance to Jesus in His Church, that they may be re-united in the peace of the Risen Lord.

SEASON OF CREATION 1 September—4 October

Pope Leo XIV's prayer intention for September 2025 is for "our relationship with all of creation.

This month the Holy Father invites us to pray that "inspired by Saint Francis, we might experience our interdependence with all creatures who are loved by God and worthy of love and respect."

"Lord, you love everything you have created, and nothing exists outside the mystery of your tenderness.

Every creature, no matter how small, is the fruit of your love and has a place in this world. "Even the simplest or shortest life is surrounded by your care. Like St. Francis of Assisi, today we too want to say:

'Praised be you, my Lord!"

In a press release accompanying the prayer, the Pope's Worldwide Prayer Network – which is responsible for preparing each month's intention – notes that the intention is within the context of the *'Season of Creation'*, an ecumenical period from September 1 to October 4 (the Feast of Saint Francis of Assisi) that unites Christians from various denominations in prayer and action for the care of the earth."

This year's Season of Creation takes place as the Church marks both the 800th anniversary of Saint Francis of Assisi' "Canticle of Creation" and the 10th anniversary of Pope Francis' encyclical Laudato si.

"The Jubilee of Hope and the 10th anniversary of the Encyclical Laudato Si' invite us to live a moment of gratitude, commitment to and care for our common home." —Cardinal Michael Czerny, the Prefect of the Dicastery for Promoting Integral Development—
