The message of the Cross is not condemnation, but salvation. Not despair, but hope.

Such themes are strongly evident in Pope Leo's comments on migrants and refugees. 'In a world darkened by war and injustice,' he says, 'even when all seems lost, migrants and refugees stand as messengers of hope. Their courage and tenacity bear heroic testimony to a faith that sees beyond what our eyes can see and gives them the strength to defy death.'

Indeed, he suggests, they 'remind the Church of her pilgrim dimension, perpetually journeying towards her final homeland.'

'Their presence, then,' the pope declares, 'should be recognised and appreciated as a true divine blessing, an opportunity to open oneself to the grace of God, who gives new energy and hope to his Church.'

We too, in turn, have the opportunity to 'be a living witness to hope, one that is understood as the promise of a present and a future where the dignity of all as children of God is recognised.'

We are called therefore to be people who welcome the stranger, manifesting the hope of the Cross where and when we can.

REFLECTION

Today we concentrate on the power of the cross in our lives. It is the ultimate demonstration of the nature of God. Christ gave of himself even to death on the cross. This is characteristic, not only of the man Jesus, but of the Godhead. Creation is the first example of divine emptying; redemption is the ultimate example. Unlike Good Friday when we stand before the stark cross and mourn the death of our innocent messiah, today we stand before the glorious cross and praise God for God's incomprehensible goodness toward us. God's graciousness is poured out indiscriminately, prodigally as only profound love can be given. Such is the nature of our God, and the cross is the symbol of this nature.

Jesus compares the pole in the wilderness on which was fixed the serpent to the cross which becomes the source of our healing. It was through the cross that Jesus conquered sin and death and won for us access to God. It is through the cross that we die to sin and rise to new life in Christ. As painful as life's crosses may be, they serve to transform us. It can be our hope in the midst of pain and suffering and brokenness, because it promises to carry us into new life.

Through the goodness of God, which has been poured out for us, we have been granted eternal life. It is incomprehensible to think that death is the way to life, but that is the message of this feast. The cross, which is a sign of shame and misery, is now a symbol of glory and exaltation.

During the very first Mass for the Care of Creation, Pope Leo commented on how 'the liturgy represents life.' Given this, we should learn to more fully appreciate the relationship between the prayer of the Church and the Church's concern for the world.

Indeed, the pope wants us to 'pray for the conversion of the many people, inside and outside the Church, who do not yet recognise the urgent need to care for our common home.' Pope Leo affirms that Pope Francis' teaching in Laudato Si' and Fratelli Tutti 'continues to be timely.'

So too does the example of Our Lord. The Gospels clearly show us that in Galilee Jesus revealed his own 'deep connection with that land and those waters, with the rhythm of the seasons and with the life of creatures.' We too, to be truly Christ-like, cannot then turn our backs on creation.

'Our mission to care for creation, to foster peace and reconciliation, is Jesus' own mission,' Pope Leo declares. It is 'the mission that the Lord entrusts to us.'

'We hear the cry of the earth and we hear the cry of the poor,' the pope says in echo of his predecessor, 'because this plea has reached the heart of God. Our indignation is his indignation; our work is his work.'
