Justice, Pope Leo says, 'cannot be reduced to the mere application of the law or the work of judges, nor limited to procedural aspects.' As the Pope points out, 'the persistence of the widow who urges the judge to recover his sense of justice' speaks to the real meaning of the concept. Justice means more than the keeping or enforcing of rules.

Because justice is a cardinal virtue, the Pope reminds us, it should always inform and guide our consciences and actions. 'When justice is exercised,' he says, 'one places oneself at the service of individuals, society and the state, with full and unwavering dedication.'

Referring to 'the deep desire for justice that is present in each of us, the thirst for justice that is the key instrument for building the common good in every human society,' the Pope encourages us to consider what justice demands with respect to individual dignity and communal relationships. True justice, he affirms, 'establishes a circularity of social relations, which places the value of every human being at its core.' For Christians, therefore, justice cannot be selfish or dismissive. Rather, justice should positively orient our relations with each other. 'As we know,' the Pope continues, 'justice becomes concrete when it reaches out to others, when each person is given their due, until equality in dignity and opportunity among human beings is achieved.' In the gospel of Luke, widows represent the lowly of society. They also are a measure of how the society is travelling. In the Old Testament, God commanded the people to care for widows, orphans and strangers. Widows, in particular, were to be cared for by the whole community. From that point on, the level of compassion within the society could be measured by the care extended to the widows. A number of the prophets point to neglect of the widows as a sign that the community has turned its back on the covenant with God. The gospel of Luke picks up this prophetic tradition and on several occasions uses widows as the key figures in stories or parables.

In this parable, the widow is petitioning her local judge for justice against towards the widow, but the judge fobs her off repeatedly. The widow, knowing that her cause is just, persists and finally wears down the judge.

Another feature of the gospel of Luke is that the lowly and poor – represented here by the widow – are those who recognise their own condition and call on the mercy of God to lift them up. Jesus says that God will see justice done to those who cry out for God's help. Jesus' final comment about finding any faith on earth is a reminder that human beings have a tendency to think they can solve all their own problems and forget that they need God's action in their lives. The faithful in the gospel of Luke are those who know that they are in need of God's mercy and love and call out for it.



Bishop Edwin Mwansa Mulandu was ordained in 2001, he served as a priest, lecturer, and National Director of the Pontifical Mission Societies in Zambia, passionately spreading the Gospel. Pope Francis appointed him Bishop of Mpika in 2021. Since then, he has worked tirelessly to strengthen communities, empower youth, and inspire faith. Bishop Edwin Mwansa Mulandu is not just a leader; he is a father to the faithful, A source of inspiration, and a true servant of God. His life continues to inspire.

A 'NEW' SAINT WITH A LOCAL LINK

Peter To Rot (1912-1945) will be canonised this Sunday, 19 October.

St Peter spent his life in and around Rakunai village in a remote part of the island of New Britain, now part of Papua New Guinea. Peter's parents were among the first local Christians in the area, baptised by Missionaries of the Sacred Heart priests who brought the gospel to the region. This is the same order, the MSCs (from their initials in French), who founded Downlands College in our parish and of which Fr Vince Carroll is a member. As a young man, Peter became a lay-catechist in his village and its surrounds, very actively and faithfully assisting the MSC parish priest. Peter married Paula la Varpit in 1936, and they had three children.



In 1942 the Japanese army occupied New Britain. They interned all foreign missionaries. Before being taken away from Rakunai, the MSC parish priest asked Peter to take over the running of the parish. He did so, first openly and then, when all religious work was banned, in secret. Late in 1944 he was arrested after helping rescue a woman from a polygamous marriage into which she had been forced after being kidnapped. As well, he was reported to the authorities for continuing to engage in secret religious activities. He was imprisoned.

On 7 July 1945, Peter To Rot was killed by the occupiers by lethal injection and by being forced to drink poison. He was 33. Honoured immediately by his local community for his holiness, his fame spread among the Christians of what became Papua New Guinea. He was beatified by Pope St John Paul II in 1995.
