Pope Leo insists upon our recognising 'the close connection between Christ's love and his summons to care for the poor.' The Pope reminds us that 'contact with those who are lowly and powerless is a fundamental way of encountering the Lord of history. In the poor, he continues to speak to us.'

Think about that for a moment: Here, now, our Lord is speaking. Where need is present, Christ is present.

The Lord of History is ever calling to us, summoning us to action. 'In hearing the cry of the poor,' the Pope says, 'we are asked to enter into the heart of God, who is always concerned for the needs of his children, especially those in greatest need.' We, therefore, should constantly seek to re-enter 'the heart of God' by listening to those who cry out for justice.

It is 'Christ himself', the Pope reminds us, who suffers with the materially poor, the 'socially marginalised', and the culturally impoverished. To ignore the poor is to ignore Christ.

We must learn to see beyond any ideology or prejudice that justifies inaction or indifference – even those cloaked under the cover of pious affirmations. As the Pope declares emphatically, this is not optional for Christians because charity is 'the burning heart of the Church's mission.'

Standing in the Humus of Life

This parable begins 'Two men went up to the Temple to pray'. But only one of them actually prayed: 'God be merciful to me, a sinner'. The other informs God how well he is doing in the piety stakes. Notice that he strings together a whole lot of verbs, all in the first person singular! This means he is in mortal danger of staying in the first person singular after death, which is Hellish.

The other is said to be 'humble'. I like the English companion word: 'humus'. He is well-grounded, knows where he is standing, sometimes in the manure of life.

It takes courage and humility to admit to God exactly where we stand. We can do so in Confession, or less formally simply praying: 'God, be merciful to me, a sinner'.

We could pause for a moment to humbly pray so that we may hope to hear Our Lord say: 'This woman, this man, this boy, this girl, went home at rights with God.'

and forget that they need God's action in their lives. The faithful in the gospel of Luke are those who know that they are in need of God's mercy and love and call out for it.


