MISSION STATEMENT

Drawing our attention to how Jesus' death manifested the most 'radical poverty', Pope Leo reminds us that Jesus 'died as an outcast'. God became human, sharing in our experiences of rejection and suffering – even death.

On this basis, the Pope affirms, Christ 'asks us, his Church, to make a decisive and radical choice in favour of the weakest.' We are called to be a compassionate Church, a people prepared to share the suffering of others in order to lift them up. We are called to be 'a Church of the Beatitudes, one that makes room for the little ones and walks poor with the poor, a place where the poor have a privileged place.'

After all, the Pope says, Jesus came into human history 'not only as a poor Messiah, but also as the Messiah of and for the poor.' His followers therefore are called to follow him in this 'preference for the poor.' We are all summoned to 'become an image of Christ and his mercy towards the weakest.'

Therefore, as the Pope declares: 'The clear and forceful words of the Gospel must be put into practice.' Like the earliest Christians, who 'had no doubt' about their charitable responsibilities, we must learn to follow Jesus 'by placing charity towards all at the centre' of everything we do. [Quotes from Apostolic Exhortation Dilexi Te]

Reflection 'Indeed, I promise you: today you will be with me in Paradise.'

Today, many of us will visit the grave or plinth of a beloved member of the family or a friend. If you are like me, you will first tidy the area, prune any dead heads off the rose bush, place some fresh flowers and then pray.

The beautiful Catholic custom is that on this day especially – All Souls' Day – we pray for those who have died. We prayed for them when they were with us on earth. Death is no barrier to continuing that prayer. We pray for them and for ourselves that one day, when every tear is wiped away, we may join them in heavenly bliss.

What grounds our hope? Nothing more, nothing less, than the victory of Jesus Christ over death. We pray that those we love even now are sharing in the benefits of that triumph.

For most, as I expect for me, that may involve a purging of those traits of personality which prevent the fullest participation in the bliss of Heaven. But that bliss is what God desires for each one of them and for me.

God prays for the fulfilment of that desire whilst souls are being purged (whatever that may involve). Our praying for the dead is simply our participation in this prayer of God, our privilege which we intentionally share in. Even those not intentionally sharing our faith often say R.I.P., rest in peace, and that is a prayer! And so we pray with confident Christian hope:

'Endless light shine on those we love, O Lord. May their souls and the souls of all those who have died, through the mercy of God rest in peace. Amen.' @ Fr Michael Tate
