## POPE LEO'S LENS

'Responding to today's challenges may sometimes seem beyond our capabilities,' Pope Leo says, 'but this is not the case.' He calls on us to 'work together to set humanity free from the encircling gloom' that 'threatens to "cancel" hope.'

Reflecting on St John Henry Newman's hymn, *Lead, Kindly Light*, the Pope wants us to 'disarm the false reasons for resignation and powerlessness.' He wants us to 'share the great reasons for hope in today's world.' Even in the darkness, we see a great light.

With our eyes focused on the true light of this world, we are called to be pointers to it.

'Let us', the Pope says, 'reflect upon and point out to others those "constellations" that transmit light and guidance at this present time, which is darkened by so much injustice and uncertainty.'

Indeed, our own lives should become living reflections of that light. 'Life shines brightly not because we are rich, beautiful or powerful', the Pope says. 'Instead, it shines when we discover within ourselves the truth that we are called by God, have a vocation, have a mission, that our lives serve something greater than ourselves.'

'Every single creature has a role to play', he continues. 'The contribution that each person can make is uniquely valuable.' For that reason, we should also always be open to the light shining in those we meet.

## REFLECTION

Discipleship is not something that we take upon ourselves. We are called to it. Some people are very conscious of this call. They are aware of it in their aspirations and dreams; they recognise it in the events of their lives. They hear the call as clearly as Simon, Andrew, James and John heard the voice of Jesus. For others, the call to discipleship is not so clear. They may experience an undefined restlessness, a dissatisfaction with their lives. People can respond to the call in one of two ways. They can consider the mere suggestion of discipleship an intrusion into their plans, or they can drop what they are doing, leave their former concerns behind and follow Jesus.

There is a misunderstanding about being called and leaving everything behind. Although the gospel says that the four men left their occupation of fishing in order to follow Jesus, this kind of 'leaving behind' was not, and still is not, required of all, for it is in the ordinary events of life that our salvation unfolds. For most people, this is precisely where they are to function as disciples. Still, disciples of Jesus are called to leave behind certain ways of living as they follow him. They are called away from lives of pettiness and division. They are called away from the kind of factionalism that seems to have threatened the unity of the Corinthian community. They are called away from narrow-mindedness and mean-spirited competition. It is much easier to leave nets than to leave the web of one's prejudices.

**2026 marks the 800th anniversary of the death of St Francis of Assisi. In recognition of this historic anniversary, Pope Leo XIV has proclaimed a **Special Year of St Francis****

10 January 2026 to 10 January 2027

.....In a statement announcing the decree's promulgation, the Franciscan Friars invited Catholics to take part in the Jubilee celebrations, expressing the hope that St Francis' example would inspire participants 'to live with authentic Christian charity towards our neighbour and with sincere longings for concord and peace among peoples'.

In their statement, the friars also hoped that this year of St Francis might 'be for each one of us a providential occasion for sanctification and evangelical witness in the contemporary world, for the glory of God and the good of the whole Church'.

**"Give us the courage to build bridges where the world raises up boundaries"** ... intercede for us so that we may become peacemakers: unarmed and disarming witnesses of the peace that comes from Christ.

In a letter dated 10 January to the ministers general of the Conference of the Franciscan Family, Pope Leo said St Francis' message of peace was needed now more than ever.

'In this age, marked by so many seemingly interminable wars, by internal and social divisions that create mistrust and fear, he continues to speak. Not because he offers technical solutions, but because his life points to the authentic source of peace,' the Pope wrote.

That peace, the Pope added, 'is not limited to the relations between human beings' but extends to 'the entire family of Creation'.

'This insight resonates with particular urgency in our time, when our common home is threatened and cries out under exploitation,' he wrote. 'Peace with God, peace among human beings, and with creation are inseparable dimensions of a single call to universal reconciliation.'

Pope Leo concluded his letter with a prayer to St Francis, asking the saint's intercession 'to give us the courage to build bridges where the world raises up boundaries.....For the complete article visit:
